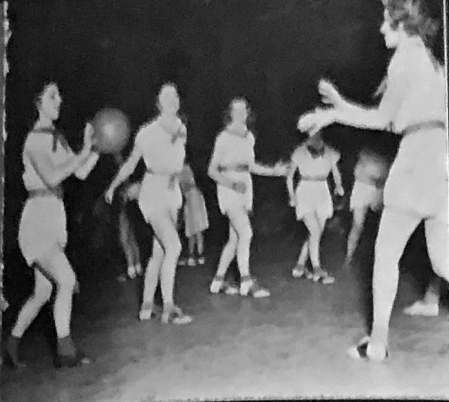
Annual Sports Nite Impressed Thousands
