ELIGIBILITY

- Open to all artists eighteen years of age or older
- Any media may be entered with the exception of video/film
- Work must have been created in the last three years and not previously exhibited at the Trenton City Museum
- Work must be properly framed, professionally presented, wired and ready to hang; no sawtooth hangers will be accepted
- Work on paper must be under glass or Plexiglas
- Heavy sculpture must be on a dolly to facilitate movability
- 3-dimensional work must be easily moved by two people; artist may be asked to supply a suitable base
- Neither height nor width of pieces may exceed 72"
- Multi-panel diptychs or triptychs will be judged as one piece
- Artists must provide digital image of all accepted work.

The Museum reserves the right to disqualify any entry for any reason including, but not limited to, work that is deemed poorly matted or framed, is presented unprofessionally, is too fragile or imposes special handling.

ENTRY FEE

- \$20.00 fee for the first entry, \$15.00 for each additional piece. Members of the Trenton Museum Society and students with college ID receive \$5.00 off the first entry
- Payment by cash, personal check, (made payable to the Trenton Museum Society), credit card, or money order is required at time of submission and must accompany artwork and entry form

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

- Submit a maximum of two entries per medium see next page
- Complete the Registration Form with artist's name, address, phone number and email; and title of artwork, medium, date created, dimensions, sale price or insured amount if not for sale
- The labels must be filled our completely and attached to back of each piece of art
- Submit a one page, reproducible copy of your resume

INSURANCE AND SHIPPING

The Trenton City Museum will insure artwork for theft and breakage caused by patrons or staff, from the time the work is received at the museum until it is picked up by the artist or an authorized representative on the specified pickup date. The insured value is 60% of the sale price. Artists must provide their own insurance for work in transit to and from Ellarslie. It is the responsibility of the artist to deliver and pick up their work at the time designated. Artwork remaining 30 days after the specified pick-up date will become the property of the Trenton Museum Society. These rules will be strictly enforced.

RESULTS, RECEPTIONS, AWARDS AND SALES

- A list of accepted artwork for the Ellarslie Open 31 will be posted on the museum website, www.ellarslie.org on Friday March 28, 2014.
- Artists must provide a 1 3 MB digital image of all accepted work to exhibits@ellarslie.org by April 2, 2014.
- The Trenton Museum Society will host a VIP Night reception on Friday, May 2, 2014 from 6:00 pm-8:00 pm at a cost to the public of \$10 in advance, \$15 at the door. Awards will be presented at the May 2 reception at about 6:30 pm. Artists and one guest are admitted free of charge.
- The general public is invited to a free reception on Saturday, May 3, 2014 from 6:00 pm- 9:00 pm. Artists may invite an unlimited number of guests.
- Five exhibit invitations will be made available to each artist for pickup at Ellarslie.
- Artists receive a 60% commission on all art sales during the exhibit

CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT

- Work submitted to the Ellarslie Open must be available for the entire duration of the exhibit and may not be removed for any reason until the exhibit ends on June 22, 2014
- The Trenton Museum Society reserves the right to publish digital images for publicity purposes
- The Trenton Museum Society will not be responsible for work remaining after the specified pick-up date
- Submission of entries will constitute agreement to the conditions set forth in this prospectus



A Short History of the Ellarslie Open

During the early years of the museum, the focus was on acquiring items to expand the decorative arts collection. Museum director Ben Whitmire (1978-1988) changed the focus to include

temporary exhibitions of contemporary art with an emphasis on Trenton area artists. In 1982. he established the Ellarslie Open to encourage local artists to submit their work for judging and display. Since then, the Trenton City Museum has displayed the work of over seven hundred local and regional artists, many selected on the basis of work they submitted to the Ellarslie Open. Today, the Ellarslie Open has become a significant exhibition in its own right, drawing on



the work of professional artists from the tri-state region and beyond, while encouraging and recognizing emerging artists.

Kelly Baum, Ph.D., Juror

Kelly Baum, Ph.D., is Haskell Curator of Modern and Contemporary Art at Princeton University Art Museum, where she has organized several critically lauded exhibitions. Her most recent New Jersey as Non-Site, closed in January 2014. She has been working as a curator and scholar for more than a decade. Prior to her arrival at Princeton in 2008, she held curatorial positions at the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, and the Blanton Museum of Art at the University of Texas at Austin. Kelly has organized several exhibitions, including Carol Bove (2006); Jedediah Caesar (2007); The Sirens' Song (2007); Transactions (2007); Nobody's Property: Art, Land, Space, 2000–2010 (2010); and Doug Aitken: migration (empire) (2010). She also has published essays on subjects ranging from Ana Mendieta and Santiago Sierra to Michèle Bernstein and the Situationist International in such journals as October, Art Journal, and the Princeton University Art Museum's Record. She oversees the Museum's Sarah Lee Elson, Class of 1984, International Artist in Residence Program and serves as a curatorial advisor to the University's campus art committee.
